ILLINOIS AGRICULTURAL LEADERSHIP PROGRAM GRADUATES THE CLASS OF 2012

Twenty-nine agricultural leaders from across the state of Illinois graduated from the Illinois Agricultural Leadership Program (IALP) at a ceremony held in Chicago August 9th.

Class members began the program in the fall of 2010 and experienced 14 seminars over 23 months. Those seminars included topics such as leadership and communication skills, economics, business decision making, national and international agriculture policy, global "With the graduation of this, our 15th class, we have added to a network of informed, capable, motivated and highly regarded leaders who are dedicated to helping each other, their communities, their nation, and their industry."

The IALP Class of 2012 also spent one week in China and one week in India as part of an International Travel Seminar. In addition, during a week-long seminar in Washington, D.C., the class heard presentations by 53 speakers at nine federal agencies and by ten agricultural associations and industry representatives.
